

Position Title: Certified Nuclear Medicine Technologist

Position Concept: The Certified Nuclear Medicine Technologist is responsible for Nuclear Lab operation, including testing equipment, educating patients and families regarding the procedures, and performing the procedures in accordance with all applicable policies, procedures and standards.

Minimum Qualifications: The Certified Nuclear Medicine Technologist must be an excellent communicator with ability to deal with people at all levels of the organization. Must possess excellent organization skills, writing skills and have extensive computer experience. Graduate of accredited Nuclear Medicine Technology program. Certified, or eligible for certification, by the Nuclear Medicine Technology Certification Board OR the American Registry of Radiological Technologists (ARRT). NYS license required. PET/CT Certified preferred.

Position Responsibilities: The Certified Nuclear Medicine Technologist position responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Prepares, measures and administers radiopharmaceuticals for the use in diagnostic cardiac studies.
- Oversees stress tests and helps attending physicians in case of stress test related emergencies.
- Ensures all equipment is operating properly. Performs quality control on Imaging and non-imaging nuclear equipment.
- Performs end of the day survey of the areas, personnel monitoring for radiation and takes corrective actions if readings fall out of range.
- Responsible for dose administration and calculations, performs QC procedures, has thorough knowledge and understanding of imaging technologies employed.
- Performs imaging procedures assigned and prepares results for interpretations, including labeling, formatting and associated paperwork.
- Recognizes malfunctioning equipment and performs minor troubleshooting, performs computer processing of acquired imaging procedures; resolves minor technical problems related to image quality and quantitative results.
- Conducts wipe tests, surveys and waste disposal as required.
- Complies with Federal, State and local requirements and regulatory agencies; maintains a clean, safe work environment and observes safety procedures and testing.
- Start and remove IV's.
- Other duties as assigned.

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
